#### What are we doing to intervene with students?

- Second Step (PK-8)
- Capturing Kids Hearts (K-8)
- Kansas University College and Career Competency Framework (high school only)
- School-Based Mental Health @ all levels (PK-12)
- Counselors Added- Ratio 1:250 (Current #s 1:450)
- School Psychologists Added
- Tertiary Support Intervention Team
- Trauma Informed Training
- Restorative Justice Program

# Digging Deeper

### Studying student & staff attendance

- Policy and procedures
- Uniform response from all buildings
- Work with parents
- Require parent meetings
- Hire Truancy Officer
- Track attendance more effectively
- Get students & staff excited to come to school!
- "I wish my teacher knew" assignment reveals kids' hardships

## Partnerships Are Important

#### Communication between agencies on students

- Release of Information forms HIPPA considerations
- Transparency with Parents we are all on the same team similar to a "wrap-around" process
- Updates on student progress
- Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) what is in place and what needs improvement
