- Criteria for admission
- Least Restrictive Environment

- Administrative Support
 - Top down support
 - Value of Superintendent, Special Education/Pupil Services Director, Building Principal
 - Building Culture to accept ES program
- Classroom Set up and Staff
 - Qualifications for ES Classroom teacher, Mental Health Therapist, Paraprofessionals
 - Communication Loop
 - Professional Development
- Other Participants
 - Teachers
 - Families**
